What is happening?

- **As you may know, Friends of Thringstone has planted and also maintain 5 flowerbeds in the village.**

We plant these using our own funds which we raise by various events we attend and put on, and also occasionally from local sponsorship. The areas we look after are down Brook Lane, down by the side of the Co-op, down Millhouse, one of the flowerbeds on The Green and the planting down by the church wall. We also planted shrubs at the bottom of Loughborough Road just past Thringstone Members Club and trees in a nature area at the bottom end of Main Street not far from the Henson's Lane junction. During August, we started to cover over the grass by the footpath to the side of The Co-op, known to locals as Drury Lane. Many people have said that it is a shame the grass is now mostly gone (we have left some) and questioned why we did this. The main reason was dog fouling. The area became very difficult to mow with safety because of the huge amount of dog fouling there, and we decided that it was best to cover the grass over and plant more shrubs, in an attempt to deter dog owners from letting their animals foul the area. Tragically, some of the new shrubs have subsequently been damaged and will need replacing. We are sorry if people feel that the area isn't as pleasant as it was to walk down, but are sure you can appreciate the problems which this issue caused to us, our equipment and our gardening team.

At the end of the day, for those who remember before 2005 when we started working there, it was just a hugely overgrown and rubbish filled area with a tiny walkway, so is vastly better now.

- Thank you to people who have contacted us with photos of their days at **Thringstone Primary**. We are sure there are others of you out there who may have some photos you can let us scan and return to you. If so, please get in touch.
- **New publications – Scottish in Thringstone.** Based on the filming we did with various people in the village in 2011 and 2012, but including the stories of others we have spoken with subsequently, this new booklet tells the stories of people who came to the village (sometimes with their parents) in the 1960s. This booklet is £2.50 and is available from the number above, as well as at our usual outlets. A further booklet called **Memories 3** gives the memories of a group of people in the village both currently and in the past, and is now also available. The cost for this is also £2.50.
- **Thringstone Bowls Club** wishes to thank Mrs Cross for donating a trophy to be used for the anticipated inaugural competition for the junior section they are putting together.
- **Did you used to run a business in the village? Did you come to the village for work from other parts of the country?** We would like to hear from you if you did. If anybody can help at all

- We need photos of anybody whose family were in the village and served in the **First World War**. All photographs can be scanned and returned to you. Please let us know if you can help. We have recently acquired several wills relating to men connected with the village who died in World War One. If a member of your family died in this conflict, and you think we might have a will you wish to copy, please contact us.
